The 84-room Romeo Hotel, designed by the late Pritzker Prize-winning Japanese architect Kenzo Tange, with its glass and cantilevered metal façade angularly arranged is a sharp contrast to Naples' rather dowdy grand dame hotels. Now, in addition to contemporary art by Francesco Clemente and collectible furniture from notables such as Brazil's Campana brothers, the hotel has added a full-service luxury spa, the first in the city. has approximately 3,000 square feet of serenity (and sweat) and boasts a hammam and a salt room—a detoxifying cocoon of the white stuff; pools—whirlpool, airpool and a thalasso waterfall pool that hits the neck just right; saunas and a frigidarium. Naturally there's a state-of-the-art gym as well as trainers on demand. Less expected is the professional Virtual Golf system and supervised children's area, chock full of games and well out of screeching distance. From €240 (\$350) a night.
